

ITEMS PROHIBITED AT THE 2018 NEBRASKA WING SUMMER ENCAMPMENT

The following items WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AT THE ENCAMPMENT and will be confiscated unless otherwise noted.

1. Cell phone are not to be brought to encampment. Exception is the encampment staff and only for encampment business. Phones are available for emergencies.
2. Food and beverages of any sort are not allowed in the dormitory/billets, with the exception of water. This includes candy, gum, chips, snack food, confectionery items, canned goods, packaged products, fruits, produce, energy drinks/mixes of any type, etc.
3. Any portable electronic gaming device.
4. Any music device, including but not limited to; I-pods, MP3 devices and portable radios.
5. Weapons- this includes anything from a toy gun to real guns and any type of knife.
6. Any T-shirts, shoes or other clothing with inappropriate sayings/slogans/print. The decision on the appropriateness of an item is left to the discretion of the encampment commander. The decision is final and NO appeals will be allowed.
7. Pornographic material or any material of questionable taste will be mailed home to parents/guardians with notification to the wing commander.
8. Tobacco and any tobacco products.
9. Alcohol and any alcoholic beverage of any sort.
10. Narcotics of any sort.
11. Fire starting materials to include fireworks or explosives.
12. Duct tape or rope.
13. Pets.
14. Boonie hats or berets.
15. Laser pointers.
16. Silly string or play-doh.
17. Colored hair spray.
18. Super glue.
19. Spray paint.
20. Large amounts of cash (more than \$25).
21. Service jackets.
22. Flight suits.
23. Sunglasses with faddish styles and mirrored lenses (see CAPM 39-1 Para 6.3.1.2.2)
24. Laptops. Exception is adult staff members who require laptops to perform duties.
25. Edge dressing or liquid shoe polish.
NOTE: Cadets will bring any prescription, non-prescription medications, herbals, vitamins, or supplements to a CAP activity only in the original containers in which the medication was dispensed or packaged. Prescription containers must contain the name of the prescribing physician, the name and telephone number of the dispensing pharmacy (if applicable), the name of the recipient of the prescription, and any other applicable dosing instructions. All other non-prescription medications, herbals, vitamins and supplements must also contain dosing instructions and be labeled with the cadet's name.
