

CADET AND SENIOR MEMBER CONDUCT RULES FOR THE 2018 NEBRASKA WING SUMMER ENCAMPMENT

These rules are published as a guide. It is not considered to be totally inclusive and may be expanded as circumstances dictate.

The following rules are in affect at all times.

1. Do not play with or capture animals at Camp Ashland
2. No littering
3. Flights will remain with designated Training Officers
4. When not in formation, maintain, at a minimum, two people together at all times (wingman)
5. Keep area clean, to include barracks and bathrooms at all times
6. No rough housing (goofing around)
7. Drink water regularly (refill hydration gear regularly)
8. With the exception of participating in Physical Training, cadets must carry water with them (hydration gear) at all times
9. When a higher ranking officer enters a room, call the room to attention.
10. Cadets will turn-in vehicle keys upon signing in to encampment and cannot go to their cars without permission of Training Officers or higher.
11. Do not intermingle with the soldiers on Camp Ashland, however, speak and be courteous if the soldiers approach you.
12. Cadets will salute all officers (cadets and seniors) unless in a no salute zone.
13. With the exception of physical training and personal time, cadets must have their Cadet Encampment Handbook with them at all times.

Off Limits Areas

1. The dike near the Platte River
2. Lakes on Camp Ashland
3. Stay off the grass except in designated areas
4. No further North, then Quarters 1 at the North end of encampment unless as part of an encampment activity such as PT
5. No farther South than the boxing ring
6. No farther West then the fence line

Personal Time

Do not leave flight area without permission.

The following actions are PROHIBITED at the Encampment:

Abuse - either verbal or physical

Altercations - either verbal or physical

Disrespect - to cadet or adult staff, or members of supporting units and organizations

Fraternization - beyond the bound of normally accepted propriety

Harassment - either verbal or physical

Hazing - of any sort

Insubordination - to cadet or adult staff

Lying - of any sort for any reason

Malicious Behavior - of any sort

Profane or derogatory language

Sexual Harassment - of any sort

Sexual Misconduct - of any nature

Stealing - from any person, the organization or the facility

Vandalizing Property - either personal, corporate or facility

Unauthorized Absence - at any time or from any location, assignment, class or duty

Willful Negligence - in any manner which results in any injury, damage, or loss of property

Class Room Conduct

1. No sleeping during classes. If a person feels they are falling asleep, they should excuse themselves to the back of the room to stand.
2. Raise your hand when asking a question and wait until acknowledged by the instructor. When called on the first time, stand, identify yourself, and ask your question. For follow on questions, there is no need to identify yourself again.
3. Proper posture will be maintained while sitting.
4. Sit as a flight when possible.
5. Bring notebook and writing instruments to all classes.
6. Put extra items under your chair.

Dining Facility Procedures

1. Must consume at least one glass of water (water includes flavored water) per meal.
2. No soda or pop at any time.
3. Post flight guidons at back door of dining facility.
4. Follow proper customs and courtesies at all times.
5. While in line, stand at ease and no talking.
6. No eating while in line.
7. No talking until done eating.
8. Stand at attention behind your chair until all flight members have their meals. Flight Commander/Sergeant will tell the flights when to sit.
9. Flights will enter and exit the Dining Facility as a flight.
10. Eating order will rotate with each meal as well as cleanup detail assignments.

Barracks Rules

1. No smoking, open flames or fires of any kind near the barracks.
2. Do not move furniture.
3. Males and females can only go into each other's barrack areas during down time, with permission of Flight Staff/Training Officers, and must be announced prior to entry.
4. All cadets will remain in their bunks after lights out, except in emergency or going to the bathroom.
5. All trash will be emptied daily.
6. Aisles will be kept clear at all times.
7. Barracks will be kept clean at all times with personal gear stowed in its proper place.
8. Electrical items will not be left plugged in.
9. No horseplay of any kind to include practical jokes.
10. Shoes will be worn at all times when not sleeping, to include wearing flip flops/shower shoes to and from bathroom.
11. All personnel must be on watch for their safety and the safety of others.
12. Cadets will not visit the other barracks unless on official encampment business (visiting a friend is not official business).
13. Think safety: act safely, be safe and use common sense!

Physical Training Rules

1. Guidons will not be carried to physical training at any time.
2. Hydration gear will not be worn while participating in physical training. However the gear may be brought to the activity and left in a common area.

Violation of Encampment Rules

Encampment Rules and Policies are established for the Safety and Protection of all encampment participants. They also allow the encampment to be run in an orderly, effective manner. These rules are not optional. All members must obey them. Any individual found to be in violation of the encampment rules will be subject to disciplinary actions. This action will be commensurate with the seriousness of the offense. If necessary, the individual will be expelled from the encampment by the encampment commander. Then disciplinary action may be taken by the chain of command up to the termination of CAP membership. No refunds will be given for an incomplete stay at the encampment. Unit and respective wing commanders will be notified of a cadet being expelled from the encampment.
